Formerly the Local Government Energy Partnership (LGEP), ABAG Energy Watch is about to kick off another 2 years of assistance to local governments. The ABAG Energy Watch Program, in partnership with PG&E, will continue to assist local governments with implementing energy and cost saving projects in public facilities, and provide technical assistance for energy policy development.

The program has been designed to enable your agency to take advantage of critical resources (technical and administrative services and incentive/rebate funds) in order to complete energy and money saving projects.

New services and dedicated incentive funds

Building on to the portfolio of services offered under the LGEP program, ABAG Energy Watch will be adding retro-commissioning, and greenhouse gas emission analysis services. The Program will also have an incentive budget that is specifically earmarked for your energy efficiency projects.

Alameda, Contra Costa, Napa, San Mateo, Santa Clara, Solano and Sonoma
